
## Help A Child Smile Mobile Dental Program

# A First Lego League Team Visits GAB!





In order to participate in First Lego League's annual tournament, every FLL team needs to conduct a research project related to FLL's annual theme - "the City Shaper" (for this season). FLL ask each team to "find a problem with a building or a public place and provide a solution." Their preliminary research lead them to the accessibility to visually impaired people. Therefore, they wanted to learn firsthand what difficulties the visually impaired people face, how they cope with them, and what changes they would like to see made to their environment. So they contacted Mrs. Cheryl Moore at GAB to schedule a tour! This FLL team came from Dekalb County in Atlanta and they all wore the same color blue shirts to tour GAB. They interviewed students in the Media Center to ask questions about the changes students want and need. They toured the whole campus to see how the students use their canes and different ways they get around. Our visitors brought gifts for the visually impaired that they had selected themselves and enjoyed giving to our students. Below they visited Mrs. Creech classroom and got to meet her students. The visitor enjoyed feeling Braille and typing out Braille on the Braille note and worked with our Orientation and Mobility student, Michelle, to understand how our students use their canes properly.
