






Beauty, Bling, and Braille



Maddison Hoffman, better known as Maddie, is a new student at GAB this year, and she sure knows how to make a Braille device beautiful! Her device is bedecked with brightly colored jewels. From bright pink and green, to shimmering gold and silver, Maddie's technology is ablaze in a kaleidoscope of color. One might wonder why a young lady with blindness would "bling-out" her device, but she will tell you it's all about two things—accessibility and beauty. "Well, for one thing, I thought it would be cool. For another thing, I did the keys because of my hands," Maddie said. "I have two fingers on my left hand, so I did the jewels on the left side to support my hand. I did the rest of the keys to make it look pretty," she explained, beaming as brightly as the gems she so proudly displays. Watching Maddie use her device to overcome accessibility obstacles by operating her phone, completing her assignments, and sending emails through a jeweled touch shows anyone the true beauty of her creation—independence. As the great American poet, Oliver Wendell Holmes, once said, "beauty is the promise of the future," and, with her bling, what a promising, beautiful future is ahead of our Miss Maddie!
