



Students used their cell phones to scan the QR code to listen to the link tell them the piece of lab equipment and its different parts and functions. Madison and John were able to scan the QR code I put on screen for them to listen on their phones and later they responded to questions from Dr. Dapke...You might even be able to zoom in on your phone's camera to scan the QR code I have in my hand to listen. – Dr. Bennett




Let's Play

Ms. Thompson and Ms. Lynch's economics class put a modern spin on the classic Parker Brothers game, PayDay! Students took their knowledge of economics concepts and used the original games framework to create "Pandemic

Payday." A game board was made and with the help of Ms. Smith, 3D game pieces were made. These game pieces include a qtip covid test, toilet paper, a mask, a syringe for the vaccine, a bottle of hand sanitizer and of course the covid-19 virus. Spaces on the board include things such as a space that requires the player to roll the Brailled dice to determine if they lose a turn (get quarantined) for one or two weeks (turns), win money for being a part of the vaccine clinical trial, and paying a fee for not having exact

The new PBIS bulletin board is located in the main hallway on the wall facing the parent resource room. In order to showcase staff that give out Panther Paw tickets, we are drawing tickets from the Panther every Friday. When students are shopping the PBIS cart, after they make their selection, then they pay the panther by putting their tickets in. When Mr. Smith draws a ticket out of the panther with a staff member's name on it, then he announces the staff member of the week.
