Surveys Matter! Surveys Matter!

Important Information for Families from the Georgia Department of Education (GaDOE)

Why are you being asked to complete a Statewide Survey? In order for all students to graduate prepared to achieve a lifetime of success, families need to be an important part of the school team. It is critical that the GaDOE assist us in partnering with families to raise the achievement rate for students with disabilities. Completing this survey will assist in achieving this goal.

How is this different from the surveys distributed earlier? The earlier survey was for all parents/guardians of all students in the state. This one is specifically for all parents/guardians who have a child on an IEP.

What will be done with the information collected? GaDOE Division of Special Education will work collaboratively with Parent to Parent of Georgia (P2P), the statewide Parent Training Information Center, to identify needs in family involvement within the state and local districts based on statewide survey results.

Who will see your answers? Individual answers are kept confidential. The GaDOE has contracted with evaluators at the Georgia Center for Assessment (GCA) to guarantee confidentiality. Each response will be coded by a number – not a name.

How do you complete the survey? You may complete the survey online in English and Spanish at http://www.gadoe.org/Curriculum-Instruction-and-Assessment/Special-Education-Services/Pages/Parent-Survey.aspx If you do not have access to take the online survey, please contact your Parent Mentor for a "paper" copy of the survey. For DISTRICT, scroll down to STATE SCHOOLS. You will then see GEORIGA ACADEMY FOR THE BLIND drop down on the list of the three State Schools.

Why do you want to know my child's ethnicity & disability? Geographic area, ethnicity, and disability group data is collected to ensure the results are valid and reflect the overall demographics of the state. Be sure to indicate ethnicity as requested.
