Dear GAB Families,



We have provided instructional assistive technology to ensure access to the curriculum. Case Managers and parents/guardians have worked closely together to ensure continuation of services to the best of our ability during this unprecedented challenge. We are totally confident that each family has made the best decisions for serving students this 2020-2021 year. IEP team support is evermore important as students are in environments out of the team's support. Let us know any difficulties with technology or other ways we can intervene during this school-wide virtual instruction time. Be reminded that GAB will be virtual through the month of January. As additional information is available a determination for reopening for onsite instruction will be communicated. We apologize for this inconvenience and assure everyone that all safeguards are utilized to ensure the safety of onsite operation.

Georgia Academy for the Blind has successfully completed its international outreach project, Canes for Kenya. This project, incorporating informational collaboration with Ken Medema, a Christian musician, and his organization, Interlude, began collecting gently used mobility canes for South African visually impaired students in September, 2019. Despite school closures for CoVid 19 throughout 2020, GAB became the repository for cane donations from many sources, including parents and students at GAB, the Smokey Powell Center for Assistive Technology, and Atlanta's Center for the Visually



Impaired. Additionally, the GAB Student Council adopted Canes for Kenya as their 2020 spring outreach program. Through their efforts, GAB students and staff were able to purchase breaktime healthy, packaged snacks, providing a \$60 contribution to Canes for Kenya. In November, 2020, 160 mobility canes were sent to a holding facility in Tennessee. From there, they will be shipped to Kenya when CoVid protocols allow. \$260 was also contributed from the Macon community, GAB families, and the GAB Student Council to purchase additional canes and alleviate transportation costs.


